GOOD STANDING POLICY

RATIONALE

At Boddington District High School, the Good Standing Policy supports our school's values of STRIVE, RESPONSIBLE and CONSIDERATE by acknowledging and rewarding positive behaviour, attitude, attendance and standards of uniform. It is further enforced by our Behaviour Management Policy and guidelines.

Our School community believes that learning is enhanced by an orderly, welcoming and caring environment in which students are able to engage free from disruption or any form of violence.

GOOD STANDING

To Maintain 'Good Standing' students must:

- Comply with BDHS' behaviour management guidelines, including classroom rules and procedures
- Maintain an attendance of above 85%
- Follow the school's Dress Code

Good standing is granted to all students at the start of each school year.

- Students who hold good standing are eligible to attend extra-curricular activities, excursions, inter-school sports carnivals or other off-site events.

LOSS OF STANDING

A student may lose their Good Standing as a consequence of:

- Two office withdrawals in one week.
- Suspension
- Attendance below 85% without adequate cause
- Repeated dress code violations

REGAINING GOOD STANDING

Students who have lost their Good Standing must satisfactorily complete a Behaviour Monitoring Card for one week.

Behaviour Monitoring Cards:

A green monitoring card is issued to a student who has lost their good standing. Behaviour targets are set, in negotiation with each student and points awarded by classroom teachers on how well the student is achieving these targets. Targets are related to the school's values of STRIVE, CONSIDERATE and RESPONSIBLE as well as expected levels of academic engagement. To regain good standing a student must average a '2' (satisfactory) rating each day for a period of one week. Should this rating not be achieved another Monitoring Card will be issued the following school week.

Upon successful completion of a Monitoring Card a student's good standing is reinstated. It is hoped that time spent engaging with this system will allow students to reflect on the standard of behaviour that is expected at our school.
