Lesson	Content			
1	This week you will be planning and producing your assessment task. Remember, planning is essential for this task. Use your key notes that you made and use the dot points from the video you watched in class.  Assessment Task: You are going to write a journal from the point of view of a person living during the Medieval era. You will pretend that you are the person who lived in London during the plague. Think about the You Tube video that we watched. What were the living conditions (Dirty? Clean?) of the people? Were they poor? Were they rich? What different jobs did they have? What happens if someone had the plague? Use your notes that you made in week one and if you have the internet, watch the video again to assist you with the assessment. 	Steps: What is your character's name? What was your street called? (in the video, it showed about the people living in Cock and Key Alley, London) When did it happened (in the video, it was in 1665) What did your parents do for a living? What was their job?  Examples of occupations: Baker, Nun, Grave maker, Pub worker, Lock Smith, selling groceries, Policeman, Scavenger (person that cleaned the streets) Barber. Did you have any animals? Dogs, Cats, Pigs, Chickens?			
	Once you have thought about your character and the setting of your story, follow the 'Journal Assignment' header sheet to guide you through the process.  Have a look at the marking key to help you too.			
2	Start writing your draft copy			
3	Continue writing your draft copy. Once completed, check for spelling mistakes and grammar. It's a good idea to get your draft checked by an adult.			

4 Prepare you Journal pages. **Items required: Paper** Coffee/tea bag **Hole Punch** String. Method: Coffee or Tea stain your pages. It's a good idea to make extra just in case you make mistakes when writing. Leave to Dry. Once dry, try ripping the edges carefully to give it an 'Old Look' Design your front cover. (Example: My Journal by Adam Dorsett, Dark Days by Adam Dorsett etc.) Remember, do not write your 'real name', it has to be by your 'character's name'. 5 Copy your draft work on to the prepared journal. Hole punch and secure the journal using string. End of task.

## Conventions and Features of Journal Writing:

- Multiple entries, which include the day, date and time of the entry
- Record opinions, experiences, emotions, feelings, thoughts, reflections on the events your character experiences
- Chronological order
- Recount structure

- First person
- Past tense, recounts events before the entry
- Informal register including slang
- Rhetorical questions
- Photos, diagrams, drawings can be included



You will get bonus points if you **decorate** your Journal in a Medieval style using Medieval fonts. **Coffee staining** has been popular in the past as has creating a **book** using multiple sheets of paper.

TIPS

Remember: what does your medieval person **know and believe**? Do they know that the rats are causing the disease? Did they call the Black Death 'plague' or did they call it **something else**? Use the **terminology** from Medieval Times. Can you find out any medieval **slang** words?
