DRESS CODE

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Boddington District High School chooses to have a dress code which is based on a uniform in school colours. As a school community we believe that a uniform:

- ◆ fosters and enhances the public image of the school - we wish students and caregivers to be proud of our school
- ◆ is non-discriminatory and does not distinguish between student from different socio-economic backgrounds
- ◆ ensures students are safely dressed for specific school activities
- ◆ presents a united image to the public and can be easily identified in the community
- ◆ assists in making a statement in the community and creates the perception of a sense of order and discipline in the school environment
- ◆ is an integral part of our commitment to Positive Behaviour Support (PBS)

GENERAL INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

Uniforms can be ordered from the school's front office. It is an expectation of the school community that all students wear uniforms at all times unless granted an exemption. Exemptions may be granted by the Principal for health or religious reasons. Students not complying with the dress code will be asked for an explanation and have parents contacted for support in conforming to dress standards. Students participating in excursions, camps or carnivals are required to wear school uniform.

Acceptance of enrolment at BDHS assumes agreement that the enrolling student will comply with the dress code unless an exemption has been granted.

DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

Shirt	Green and gold or faction coloured short or long-sleeved polo shirt with collar
Shorts/ pants	Bottle green (primary) or black (secondary)
Skirts/skorts	As above, no shorter than mid-thigh
Winter items	School jumper or any other bottle green jumper without hood
Sportswear	School faction colours may be worn
Hats	Green or Faction coloured bucket hat (primary) or black hat or cap (secondary)
Footwear	Close-toed
Hair	Long hair is to be tied up
Nails	None (primary) or clear/ discrete colours (secondary)
Jewellery	Minimal jewellery is expected. Jewellery should not be a distraction from learning
Make up	None (primary) or workplace appropriate (secondary)
