## YEAR 7/8 OPTIONS: EMERGENCY SERVICES STUDIES - UPDATE

Our purpose is to help the young know and appreciate the important work of the Emergency Services in and around Boddington. Over the year, we will use practical experiences to learn about the local Fire Brigade, State Emergency Services, St. John's Ambulance, Boddington Council Ranger Services as well as the vital role of the WA Police Service and the support offered by the emergency response teams from Newmont and South32.

In Term 1, we visited the Boddington Fire shed in town to be briefed about their important work by Captain Jared Green and other volunteers from the local Brigade.

Later, we were lucky to see quite a big group of volunteers bring their Fire appliances (trucks and Light Tankers and the Forward Command Vehicle) to the school to demonstrate how the Brigade operated and what the equipment was used for). All students had the chance to get dressed in PPE ('Personal Protection Equipment'- the fire fighters' uniform) and operate water cannons, hoses, sirens, etc. Our thanks go to Daniel Carrots, Rosie Newnham and Zoe Swift from Boddington as well as Bob Jones and Brant Leman from Marradong.

In early Term 2, our class visited the St. John's Ambulance Sub-centre in town. Ably led by Ros Forester and Ian Webster, the class had practical, potentially life-saving lessons on first aid, how the ambulance is equipped, what it can do and some real life stories about what it is like to be up at 2 am help save someone's life!

Both these vital organisations are staffed by volunteers. They have signed up to help others often putting themselves in harm's way just to be of service. On behalf of the Boddington District High School, I would like to offer our thanks in appreciation for the time and effort members of the Boddington Fire Brigade and St. John's Ambulance put into helping our young people understand how everyday people help protect our community.
