From the Principal

On Wednesday, 25 October 2023 the Year 6-10 students participated in Vaping Education Workshops presented by Blurred Minds, Griffith University. The school received a grant from Healthway which was used to cover the cost of these workshops for our students.

The workshops focused on addressing the latest evidence on vaping and health, the marketing and laws surrounding vaping, and the growing impact of vaping on the environment.



Vaping and Health

Aim: For students to walk away with an improved understanding of the adverse health effects of vapes and an increased capability to refuse vape related offers.



Topics included;

- Exploring reasons for vaping and its popularity
- Summarising latest evidence on the known health risks of vaping on the human body and brain
- Dispelling myths around the health benefits and harm reduction of vapes
- Discussing reasons for use and alternative coping strategies

Vaping and Deception

Aim: For students to walk away with more critical thoughts about how vapes are promoted and a better understanding of current vaping laws. Topics included;

- The origin and evolution of the vape industry
- How influencer marketing is used by vaping brands
- Showcasing laws for vapes and vape related behaviours

Vaping and the Environment

- Explores different types of vapes, how they work and what they are made of
- Discusses usage in Australia and the amount of vape waste that is being produced
- Discusses recycling and disposing of vapes
- Introduces effects of vape waste on our biodiversity and human health

Students will walk away with more critical thoughts about the environmental repercussions of vaping and an understanding of how difficult it is to recycle these devices.
