TEACH LEARN GROW

We were excited to once again be involved in the Teach Learn Grow Program (TLG). This program involves mentoring and outcomes-targeted mathematics tutoring from volunteer university students. Our involvement with TLG is funded by Worsley Alumina, South 32 and has been running at our school for the last 6 years. The aim of the program is to improve student understanding of selected mathematics outcomes and enhance student confidence in mathematics. Nominated students receive up to 10 hours of one-on-one mathematics tuition with university volunteers over the course of the week. An additional outcome of the program is the immersion of university students in regional communities which is beneficial for the TLG volunteers, the community and all students at the school.
