From the Principal

OUR SCHOOL - DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

At Boddington DHS it is expected that students will adhere to the school dress code. The holidays period provides families with a good opportunity to make sure they have the correct uniform items for their child, particularly as the weather starts to cool down.

It is an expectation that student jumpers/jackets will be bottle green in colour and without a hood. The uniform shop stocks two types of school jacket and these can be ordered and purchased through the Spriggy App or the front office. If students are to wear a long sleeve shirt under their T-Shirt it must be bottle green or gold (primary) or bottle green, gold or black (secondary). It must not have a hood. Students may wear a scarf or beanie at school if it is bottle green (primary) and bottle green or black (secondary). Beanies are not to be worn inside.

NAPLAN (THE NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM - LITERACY & NUMERACY)

All students in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9 across Australia in both public and private schools will participate in the NAPLAN tests starting today, Wednesday, 13 March, and finishing on Friday, 22 March 2024.

I would like parents and guardians to note that as a school we try to play down the importance of these tests to students. We are conscious of the impact these tests may have on the anxiety levels of some students and for that reason we don't make a "big deal" about them.

The major purpose of the NAPLAN is to provide schools, parents and caregivers with information about student performance in relation to nationally-agreed proficiency bands and benchmarks. The results also allow schools, parents and caregivers to monitor students' achievements over time.

Parents are asked to contact the school to inform us if your child is absent so that we can make arrangements for your child to be tested at another time within the test period. Please note that students can only be tested within the test period.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP CAMP

Next week, on Monday, 18 March our Year 6-10 Student Leaders, along with Mr Batt, Ms Martel, Ms Johnstone and Ms Whild, will be attending the GRIP Leadership conference at the Perth Convention Centre on Monday (primary) and Tuesday (secondary). The conference focuses on training student leaders for their role and includes presentations, interactive activities, discussion and leadership games. Students will be staying overnight at Woodman Point Camp School and will participate in additional leadership activities when not attending the GRIP Conference.
