OUR SCHOOL - DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

At Boddington DHS it is expected that students will adhere to the school dress code. The holidays period provides families with a good opportunity to make sure they have the correct uniform items for their child, particularly as the weather starts to cool down.

It is an expectation that student jumpers/jackets will be bottle green in colour and without a hood. The uniform shop stocks two types of school jacket and these can be ordered and purchased through the Spriggy App or the front office. If students are to wear a long sleeve shirt under their T-Shirt it must be bottle green or gold (primary) or bottle green, gold or black (secondary). It must not have a hood. Students may wear a scarf or beanie at school if it is bottle green (primary) and bottle green or black (secondary). Beanies are not to be worn inside.

Shorts/ pants Bottle green (primary) or black (secondary)
Skirts/skorts As above, no shorter than mid-thigh

Winter items School jumper or any other bottle green jumper without hood

Sportswear School faction colours may be worn

Hats Green or Faction coloured bucket hat (primary) or black hat or cap (secondary)

Footwear Close-toed

Hair Long hair is to be tied up (primary) or workplace appropriate (secondary)

Nails None (primary) or clear/ discrete colours (secondary)

Jewellery Minimal jewellery is expected. Jewellery should not be a distraction from

learning

Make up None (primary) or workplace appropriate (secondary)

NAPLAN (THE NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM - LITERACY & NUMERACY)

All students in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9 across Australia in both public and private schools have been participating in the NAPLAN, which started last week on Wednesday 12 March and finishes on Monday 24 March 2025.

I would like parents and guardians to note that as a school we try to play down the importance of these tests to students. We are conscious of the impact these tests may have on the anxiety levels of some students and for that reason we don't make a "big deal" about them.

The major purpose of the NAPLAN is to provide schools, parents and caregivers with information about student performance in relation to nationallyagreed proficiency bands and benchmarks. The results also allow schools, parents and caregivers to monitor students' achievements over time. Please note that students can only be tested within the test period.

The P&C are once again running our famous Easter Raffle and we need your help!


We are asking each family to donate easter eggs or anything easter related to include in our hampers! More donations means more prizes!
