Payment Options:

CHARGES FOR OPTIONAL ACTIVITIES THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

Charges apply for the provision of extra cost optional activities that are part of an educational program, and which “contributions” do not cover. All activities outlined below are optional and if no payment is received, an alternative educational activity will be provided for your child.

The School Board has approved all 2026 extra cost optional activities. The estimated costs provided are at an upper limit and will not exceed the amount shown. If a particular event does not transpire within the school year, no charges for that event will apply.

Please Note:

Payment for the following charges is not required at the time of finalising payment of the “voluntary contributions on the previous page. Where staff arrange extra cost optional activities, payment will be requested immediately prior to that happening.

Excursions and Incursions

Classes may attend excursions or incursions during the year. Costs are based upon travel to the metropolitan area, admittance to a typical venue or the cost of a typical incursion. Fundraising may reduce the cost to those attending.

Students wanting to use additional or more expensive materials in the Arts will be expected to pay for them.

Refund of Contributions and Charges:

If a student transfers to another school, arrangements will be made to forward a pro-rata portion of their “contributions” to their new school. Alternatively, a refund can be arranged. This amount is set by the Department of Education.
