## From the Principal

### PBS

It has been a busy and positive start to the term at Boddington DHS, with students attending camp and settling into the daily routines of school. It has been very pleasing to see students demonstrating our Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) expectations and truly 'doing their best'. I have noticed students making a conscious effort to move quietly around the school during lesson times and to return promptly after play breaks so they are ready to learn.

Our current PBS focus is **Responsible: We look after and use equipment in the correct way**. When students demonstrate this expectation, they receive individual Dojo points, which contribute towards earning rewards as they reach milestones.

Students are also recognised at a whole-school level when the combined Dojo points of all students reach set targets. I am pleased to share that students have already exceeded our first target of 5,000 points, earning over 6,000 Dojo points. As a result, they have achieved a free dress day — well done to all students for this fantastic effort! We will keep you informed of the date and details.

## LEADERSHIP CAMP

Our Year 6–10 student leaders this week had the exciting opportunity to attend the **Halogen National Young Leaders Day** at the Perth Convention and Exhibition Centre — Australia’s largest leadership event for young people. This annual conference brings together thousands of student leaders from across the country to hear from influential Australians and develop their leadership skills.

First established in 1997, National Young Leaders Day has inspired more than 365,000 young people. This year, our students joined hundreds of other Western Australian student leaders for a memorable and motivating experience.

One of the keynote speakers was **His Excellency, Governor Chris Dawson**, who shared his personal leadership journey. He reflected on his career, which began with a night shift guarding Government House and, many years later, led him back there as the 34th Governor of Western Australia. His message to students was powerful and clear — leadership is not about titles, but about following your passions, making a difference, and being honest and open with others.

Governor Dawson encouraged students to embrace the opportunity they have been given, reminding them that they have already been recognised as leaders and now have a responsibility to lead with integrity and purpose.

Our students also participated in interactive workshops, group discussions, and a leadership challenge, while staying overnight at SIDE Accommodation in Leederville. These experiences provided valuable opportunities to build teamwork, confidence, and leadership skills.

This was a highly rewarding experience for our student leaders, who represented Boddington District High School with pride. We look forward to seeing how they apply what they have learned as they continue to grow as leaders within our school community.
